1960 - 1970

The Beginning of the Awakening

With the book "Silent Spring", Rachel Carson awakened a new consciousness that flourishes from the understanding of the harms that pesticide use could cause to humans and the environment. However, public awareness of the negative impacts caused by pollution was still limited.

1980 - 1990

Our Common Future

Awareness around the socioenvironmental theme begins to grow. With regulatory threats gaining momentum, a crisis in public relations emerges. The UN addresses the topic "Future of Humanity" on a global scale for the first time, and debates on eco-efficiency gain traction. This is the decade of the Green Revolution, where the ongoing structural change starts to be seen as a business opportunity.

1800 - 1960

Irrelevance of the Socioenvironmental Theme

Starting from the famous Industrial Revolution, the modern society we know today was created, driven by a mindset of financial resource scarcity and the exploitation of natural and human resources. Until the 1960s, pollution emitted by factories was known as the "smell of money," and little was said about its harmful effects on human health and the planet.

1970 - 1980

Welfare State

Under a scenario of public pressure and regulatory demands, the U.S. **Economic Development Committee** advocates for companies to start considering the social and environmental impacts of their actions. This marks the beginning of socio-environmental obligations, where organizations start paying taxes related to socioenvironmental damages caused. The debate on Socio-environmental Risks also emerges, introducing concepts such as Ecological Economics (1971) and Welfare Economics (1972).

2000 - 2008

A Purpose is Born

Global essential values begin to align due to the joint effort in building a better future. New generations start to question the current modus operandi. Sustainability principles begin to permeate organizations, and the concept of "work with purpose" gains momentum. An intense international debate emerges regarding the integration of environmental, social, and governance issues in the capital markets. Concepts such as Green Economy and Low Carbon Economy start to be established.

2020 - Hoje

A New Consciousness

With global warming on the rise and the risk of other pandemics, humanity recognizes the urgency for change. New generations begin to assume leadership roles and reallocate capital to align with the agenda of a new consciousness. Happiness and well-being become the pillars of the emerging new system, based on collectivity, service, and regeneration. Concepts that integrate humanity with the planet, treating them as a single organism, start to take shape (BioEconomy & Sacred Economy).

1990 - 2000

Integrated Strategy

Business opportunities related to the topic begin to be explored, and corporations start to manage socioenvironmental risks, establishing their sustainability departments. This creates a proactive force within organizations, nurturing discussions on long-term sustainability vision, eco-efficiency, and clean technologies. The companies start to consider ways to integrate the topic into institutional strategy, instead of a linear approach. ESG guidelines arise through Unep-FI.

Mindset Shift


The 2008 Economic Crisis led to a reevaluation of the paths humanity had taken up to that point, resulting in a breakdown of existing models and the creation of a new standard of success. This **new mindset, based on sharing and care, reoriented business trends.** Impact investments and concepts such as Circular Economy, Sharing Economy, and Doughnut Economy emerge. Systemic and regenerative thinking gain prominence as guidelines for a new model.

Our productions are the foundation of the entire organization, nourishing our teams and our projects. Today, we work with beekeeping, meliponiculture, cashew cultivation, agroforestry systems and organic gardens.

Through our own "learning by doing" methodology, we approach education in an integrated way. By conducting experiences, hands-on activities and training at the Anjos do Sertão Farm School, we aim to transmit regenerative knowledge through practice, at the same time as we work on expanding participants' consciousness. Impact Consulting



Implementation of Vale do Mel project with raised funds & NIHA online for 800 students from the <u>Anima Education Group</u>.




2024

We, at Anjos do Sertão Institute, believe that the local communities are the true Angels of the "Sertão". Therefore, we have reserved this space for the original voices of the territory to share more about this place and its people through their perspective.





"Today, I am 64 years old. I was born and raised in Tanque da Capoeira village, which my father used to say was founded by Indigenous people. Our main activity has always been farming, planting sugarcane, cassava, corn, beans, rice and working with cattle. We used to get around only by donkey, mule or horse, but it was good—none of these internet things existed. Life in the countryside is different; I wouldn't trade it for anything, even more for a city life."
